What is Academic Writing Month?

<u>Academic Writing Month</u> (#AcWriMo) was inspired by National Novel Writing Month. It takes a similar approach but has a specific focus on academic writing rather than novel writing.

The challenge is for academic researchers to set and meet a writing goal during the month of November.

Whilst the goal is important, the idea behind #AcWriMo is to promote reflection and improvement, create good writing habits and provide an opportunity for sharing and encouragement as a wider community.

Everyone can benefit from this, whatever your career stage as an academic researcher. Will you join the challenge?

How do I take part?

To take part in Academic Writing Month you will need to:

- **Decide on your goal** this might be writing a specific number of words over the course of the month, writing at a regular time, writing for a set number of hours, reflecting on your writing practice, or completing a particular writing project.
- Share your goal by letting others know about your commitment you are much more likely to keep to it. You could do this with research colleagues, or more widely on social media (using #AcWriMo).
- Plan ahead how will you prepare for November? Think about what you will need to succeed.
- Share your progress online or in-person with your manager or research colleagues.
- **Don't give up** stay focused, stick at it, and don't get distracted (but be kind to yourself). And don't forget to encourage others with their writing efforts too!
- At the end of the month, share your results and learning. How was it for you?
